SFBC&TS's psychology classes help you use the study of human thought to solve conflicts, anticipate needs, and create better, healthier communities based on a Christian worldview. This well-rounded undergraduate psychology degree can provide you with the in-demand skills and knowledge to pursue a career in behavioral sciences, or in any people-focused industry.

The Bachelor of Arts in Psychology degree equips students with the foundational tools in psychology and counseling from a biblical perspective. Moreover, any undergraduate degree in psychology is preparatory for graduate studies. Either degree prepares students with 120 credit hours for continue studies in graduate school.
